KEY SERVICES

Air Force Aid Society. Provides emergency financial assistance, moving assistance, income management, educational loans and grants. Located at Airman and Family Readiness Center 856-6550.

Airman's Attic. Open to Air Force airmen E-4 and below. Free clothing, toys and household items. Furniture items can be obtained by contacting any First Sergeant. For more information call 856-6415.

Airman and Family Readiness Center. Services offered include: Career Focus Program, Family Life Education, Information and Referral, Personal Financial Management, Personal and Family Readiness, Relocation Assistance, Transition Assistance, School Liaison Services and the Volunteer Program plus resource rooms (computers, etc.). Alcoholics Anonymous. Assists in recovery from alcoholism and provides support and education concerning alcohol. Call 937-7770 for meeting times and locations.

Alcohol/Drug Abuse Prevention and Treatment.

Education Office. Provides educational opportunities and services to the Luke community. Educational programs offered include undergraduate, graduate, professional military, high school completion and testing services. For more information call 856-7722.

Equal Opportunity. Investigates and processes allegations of discrimination and Sexual Harassment on the basis of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, age (civilians only), and disability (civilians only) for Active Duty Military, DoD Civilians, NAF Civilians, active duty family members and Retirees. Family Advocacy. Provide assessment, violence prevention education, and operate the Special Needs Identification/Assignment Coordination Process (SNC). Classes and services include Dad's 101, New Parent Support Program, How to Avoid Marrying a Jerk/Jerkette, Stress Management briefing, Parenting Skills classes, and Anger Management classes. Family Child Care. Air Force licensed childcare providers (18 years and older) residing on and around the base will provide childcare on part-time or full-time basis. For a listing call 856-7472.

Family Services. A volunteer organization within the Family Support Center made up of military family members. Programs include the Airman's Attic, Loan Locker, New Spouse Welcome Baskets. Call 856-6415.

New Parent Support Program. Provides education and support to first time parents. Classes include Dad's 101, home visitation, Building blocks play group, sibling class, basic breastfeeding. Call Family Advocacy at 856-3417 for details.

Health and Wellness Center Offers wellness evaluations, tobacco cessation, heart disease/cancer awareness, diet and exercise classes, healthy cooking class and stress management. For more information call 856-3830.

Hearts Apart Program. Provides an avenue of communication for morale purposes between an active duty member who is deployed, TDY or on a remote assignment, and a spouse or significant other. Call the Airman and Family Readiness at 856-6550.

Inspector General. Provides varied problem-solving assistance, investigates allegations of inappropriate conduct and Fraud, Waste and Abuse. First, seek redress of perceived violations through your supervisor, first sergeant, commander, or the prescribed grievance channel. Call 856-6140.

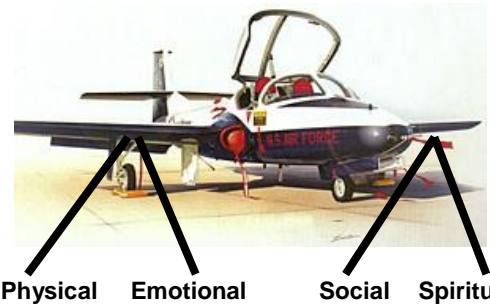
Sexual Assault Prevention & Response.

Focus on outreach; risk reduction and training to prevent sexual assault and increase awareness of the role of the Bystander in that prevention. "Prevent Sexual Assault: Ask, Act and Intervene".
